



How to Measure Your Space


A simple sketch of your room will help us get a feel for what your space looks like. Below is a sample floor plan. Once you figure out your demensions, transfer the measurements to the grid on the following page. Here is some advice to help you get started.

Tips for Measuring Your Space

- Use a pencil to facilitate easy changes
- Measure in inches only
- Be sure to note all fixtures and utilities (with dimensions)
- Also note all electrical outlets/switches (with dimensions)
- Include location and size of windows and doors
- Note the size and location of exsisting appliances
- Indicate which way doors swing and into what rooms
- Breaks in walls and obstructions should also be noted
- Denote ceiling height and indicate any transitions, soffits and/or vents
